OPR Sponsors Scholarships for College Automotive Program

At their March meeting, the Olympic Peninsula Region Board voted to sponsor two scholarships for the Peninsula College Automotive Program in Port Angeles.

Our club awarded two \$1,000 scholarships to students enrolled in the Automotive Program who demonstrate a combination of both academic achievement and financial need. This would be a significant contribution toward the annual tuition of around \$5,000 for a full-time state resident student.

Scholarships are administered by the college according to the wishes and criteria specified by the donor, and disbursed quarterly based on continuing enrollment in the program. Scholarships are awarded by a committee comprised of faculty and students.

The scholarships will be for the 2020 – 2021 school year.

The scholarships will be awarded according to the following criteria:

1. Student must be enrolled full-time in the Automotive Technology program at the college;
2. Student should have maintained at least a 2.6 (B minus) grade point average;
3. Student should have a demonstrated financial need;
4. Student should be a resident of Clallam, Jefferson, Mason or Kitsap counties.

The Board appointed OPR member Jeannie Martin to serve as a volunteer liaison to the college scholarship office to be a facilitator and help ensure that the wishes of the OPR Board are carried out. Jeannie already serves as Treasurer on the Peninsula College Foundation Board of Directors.

This is something everyone in the OPR – PCA can be proud of.

While we are told that the college respects student privacy with respect to scholarships, it would be a wonderful enhancement if we could somehow get to know our scholars. If, through the college's scholarship program, we could invite the students to participate in an OPR event, or even to attend a social event dinner as our guests, that would be marvelous. It would be rewarding for us to know about their career goals and their learning experiences.

It has even been suggested that perhaps, through our connections with the Porsche community, we could arrange an internship opportunity for the student(s) with a local Porsche garage or workshop.

Next, I really like the *Nick Murray YouTube Channel*. His videos include a great deal of Porsche focus delivered in “Kiwi Nick’s” idiosyncratic and sometimes crass style. Nick Murray is the only YouTuber known to me to have broken two 911s and have Porsche Cars NA buy them back — they may have been “lemons” (?) Nick’s channel is rather divisive too but he knows his way around the Porsche Configurator in a detail perhaps accomplished only by a good salesperson. Recently, Nick reviewed a manual gearbox 992 911 — check it out! Otherwise, buy Nick’s tee-shirts if that appeals to you and pay no attention to the presence of dogs and stuffed animals in the cars he drives. His videos are well-produced and thought provoking.

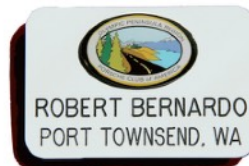
